# Loreto Normanhurst School Redevelopment Community Consultative Committee (SSD-8996) – Annual Report 2023-2024

## 1. Executive summary / introduction

The Loreto Normanhurst School Redevelopment Community Consultative Committee (SDD-8996) (LNSRCCC) was established in early 2022 in response to the approval by the Independent Planning Commission on 21 October 2021 of the school's State Significant Development Application (SSDA) for its 30-year Concept Proposal and Stage One development.

Stage One development included refurbishment of the Mary Ward Wing, construction of tennis courts with under-ground staff carpark, new pick up and drop off areas, an internal link road, refurbishment of the heritage gates, demolition of the Loreto Community House, and completion of the new Agricultural Technologies Facility. Loreto Normanhurst commenced some preparatory Stage One building works in December 2021 which are now complete.

Modification 1 to the approved SSDA was lodged in November 2023. The modification includes a 30% reduction in the size of the new boarding house building, relocation of its basement carparking to ground level, and landscaping changes. The Modification 1 application is being assessed.

#### 2. CCC activities over last 12 months:

The LNSRCCC comprises:

- six local community representatives comprising local residents and/or parents of students at Loreto Normanhurst. One community representative resigned from the committee in February 2024
- two alternating elected Hornsby Shire Council members
- the Principal and a staff member from Loreto Normanhurst, with attendance by other school staff as required
- two representatives from project managers CTPG and one from community engagement specialists Urbis, with attendance from other personnel as required
- one Independent Chairperson.

All committee members have signed the revised Code of Conduct and Declaration of Interest documents. All committee members support the LNSRCCC Terms of Reference prepared in consultation with the LNSRCCC.

Three meetings of the LNSRCCC were held during the reporting period: in May and August 2023 and in February 2024. The scheduled November 2023 meeting was not held as no construction

activity was occurring or imminent. A status update prepared by CTPG was circulated by the Chair to CCC members in lieu of the November 2023 meeting.

Meetings are held onsite at Loreto Normanhurst. No organised site inspections were undertaken in 2023-2024.

Attendance at meetings by LNSRCCC members, either in person or online, was generally good. There is a high level of engagement by the proponent and their representatives, with regular attendance by community and Council representatives. Apologies were tendered for work, leave or health related reasons.

Two representatives from traffic consultants TTW attended the May 2023 meeting to answer questions from CCC members.

Meeting agendas include a presentation on completed, in progress and upcoming construction works by CTPG; any complaints from community members received and reported on by Urbis; and discussion of issues of concern and interest to CCC members.

The LNSRCCC is effective as a conduit between local residents, the general community, Hornsby Shire Council, Loreto Normanhurst and CTPG to discuss and resolve concerns raised where possible.

Minutes of each meeting are published on the Loreto Normanhurst website.

## 3. Key issues

The key issues raised and discussed by the LNSRCCC throughout the year and actions taken to respond to issues are listed below.
