1. Executive Summary

The Mount Pleasant Community Consultative Committee was established as part of the condition of consent by the NSW Minister for Planning's 1999 approval of the Mount Pleasant Operation (Development Application 92/97).

The Mount Pleasant Operation is an open cut coal mining project that is situated west of Muswellbrook, in the Muswellbrook Local Government Area. The project produces high quality thermal coal that is approved to be exported via the Port of Newcastle and used for the local energy market. Thiese is the major mining contractor/operator on site.

The Committee includes a group of five residents who have an interest in the operations at Mount Pleasant and meet regularly with Mt Pleasant operations and a Muswellbrook Council member to discuss the project's current and future operations. The Committee follows the Department of Planning and Environment's Community Consultative Committee Guidelines for State Significant Projects. Meetings are held quarterly between the members of the Committee, including:

- Five local community representatives;
- One member from Muswellbrook Shire Council:
- Members from the MACH Energy Australia and representatives from the mine operator, Thiess, depending upon the agenda and issues to be discussed; and
- One independent Chairperson.

Discussions held in the Committee meetings where on numerous topics related to the project. While Covid 19 was still present in the community, government policies became more relaxed. The committee continues to operate and covered both new and ongoing topics including:

- Future plans for the mine, including updates the State Significant Development (SSD) application (Mount Pleasant Optimisation Project):
- MOD 6 consultation. Approved November 2023.
- Ongoing landform reshaping, Geofluv development and rehabilitation;
- Progress with the Fine's Emplacement Facility lift;
- Update on the salinity discharge pipeline;
- Mining continues to the west with CHPP Incremental Expansion in planning stage;
- Weed management and restoration projects on offset properties;
- Update on revised CCC guidelines;

- \$1M milestone achieved for community sponsorships from 2018-2013, excluding ACDF funding.
- Engagement with Muswellbrook & District Historical Society and arranged a visit to Broomfield Station for members and interested local community.

2. CCC activities over last 12 months

- Four CCC meetings were held in 2023. March, June, September, December. Some members participated online when convenient.
- Strong regular attendance from all members;
- Site visits were conducted for three of the CCC meetings throughout 2023. One meeting was held offsite at the University of Newcastle Muswellbrook Campus.
- There were no joint CCC meetings held throughout 2023;
- Presentation by Dr Dusan Iliac on the dust Lidar project with the University of Newcastle;
- Review of weed and pest control on offset properties;
- Development and adoption of the CCC Terms of Reference and signing of code of conduct forms by committee members;
- Mt Pleasant Optimisation Project continues to be challenged in the courts with an appeal lodged against the outcomes of a judicial review which confirmed the Federal Minister's decision to approve the project;
- Modification 7 is being prepared to extend the life of the mine until the end of 2032 as an alternative to the Optimisation Project; MOD 7 Social Impact Assessment interviews were conducted;
- Cate Sims provided an overview of the Upper Hunter Mining Dialogue (UHMD)
 The UHMD is seeking EOI from interested community members.
